

Daniel Boone School Demographics

- Multiple Languages: Over 20 different home/native languages (41.1% ELLs)
- Different Socioeconomic Backgrounds: 89.4% low-income students
- Diverse Learning Styles: Students with IEPs (Special Education) and non-English speakers receive instruction in the general classroom setting

Targeted Population

iPads implemented during instruction with about 160 students during their 7th and 8th grade Science and Language Arts classes

Collaboration

- Archaic Learning: No structured means for sharing. Literature discussions were conducted orally and dominated by one student or teacher.
- 21st Century Learning: Edmodo Discussion Boards enable students to merge diverse ideas and create a common understanding.
 - Posting enables all students to share their unique thinking and inferences simultaneously during learning.
 - Students have increased their ability to dialogue in writing about their understanding of text and content.

Communication

- Archaic Learning: Attainment and assessment of information limited to textbooks, worksheets, lecture and paper-pencil activities.
- 21st Century Learning: Students with diverse learning style have multiple formats to attain and communicate their learning. Teachers can now see into the minds of their students, assess understanding and clarify misconceptions.
 - *iBooks*: The post-it notes of Harvey & Goudvis' (<u>Strategies that Work</u>, 2000) brought to life! Students digitally apply reading strategies to highlight main ideas and create notes on inferences, conclusions and predictions.
 - Show Me/ Educreation: Students communicate individual understanding while improving verbal skills.
 - Pages: Writing can now be posted to share with an authentic audience.
 - *Keynote*: Students no longer read from a paper but build presentation skills by supplementing work with visuals and recordings.
 - Built-in Video/Camera: Literature discussions, peer conferencing and readers theater recorded and shared for continued improvement.

Critical Thinking

- Archaic Learning: Instruction involved science textbooks with little non-fiction content reading, teachercreated questions & organizers. Student-created questions were low-level with no real format for sharing with peers.
- 21st Century Learning:
 - With increased access to information, more inquiry skills have been embedded into our curriculum.
 Thus, students are better able to guide their own dialogue by asking high-order QAR thinking questions that build on others' ideas.
 - · Learning enriched through access to online sources and teacher-created ePubs.
 - Access to more than one source improves their ability to synthesize, compare and evaluate information.
 - Students now *apply* knowledge by creating their own graphic organizers on i*Brainstorm, Popplet* and *Screen Chomp*.



Creativity


- · Archaic Learning: Construction paper, glue, markers and maybe glitter.
- 21st Century Learning:
 - · Video and Creativity Apps engage students in project-based learning as they express their ideas

Student Engagement and Amount of Time on Task

- Archaic Learning: One hour class period resulted in 8-10 behavior redirects. Discipline interfered with teaching time as students had little intrinsic motivation.
- 21st Century Learning:
 - Quiet Classrooms! Active engagement in learning! One hour class period results in 0-2 behavior redirects.
 - Students eager to grab their iPads and ask for more work-time.

Student Ownership of Learning

- Archaic Learning: Missing assignments, distracted students, messy work that demonstrated little pride but a "hand something in" attitude.
- · 21st Century Learning:
 - · New attitude of "doing my best!"




- Instantaneous feedback encourages students to improve their performance.
- Access to authentic audiences motivates students to show their best.

Teacher Assessment

- Archaic Learning: Teachers waiting a day or week to assess student understanding and clarify misconceptions.
- · 21st Century Learning:
 - · Instantaneous feedback through online polls, discussion boards and quizzes.

Student Accessibility: Increased ability to differentiate within our diverse school population

- Archaic Learning: ELLs that could not understand lectures or text in English. Students with special needs all receiving the same modification.
- 21st Century Learning:
 - Ability to translate text and access content in a specific language or reading level.
 - Options to gain knowledge through audio or video means.
 - Opportunities to review and reinforce with *digital recording of lessons, Flashcards, Build a Body, Simple Physics, Cell Stain etc...*
